

The memory and bequest of the late Elizabeth Callender continues to be honored through ongoing beautification projects. In addition to the Route 153/Route 154 gateway plantings, thousands and thousands of daffodils now bloom in concentrated sections of Essex Village each spring. This November, another 5,000 bulbs will be planted on Route 154 in Centerbrook near the Trinity Lutheran Church, and at the entrance to the Millrace Trail in Ivoryton. The spring blooms have been enjoyed by people near and far, serving as the main attraction of the Essex Board of Trade's Daffodil Days.

Ivoryton Playhouse Steps Up in Style and Safety

Last November a \$15,000 grant was awarded to help fund the design and installation of new steps, handrails, and landing at the front entrance of the Ivoryton Playhouse. The project was initiated to improve patron safety while keeping within the period styling of the historic 1911 building.

Stocking the Tri-Town Backpack Program Pantry

A \$2000 grant was also awarded to The Backpack Program, a volunteer organization that provides students identified by social workers at Essex Elementary, John Winthrop and Valley Regional High School with nutritious food for weekends, during school vacations, or when other resources are not available. The grant award was used to purchase food items such as cereal, oatmeal, breakfast bars, milk, juice,

tuna, peanut butter, jelly, pasta, sauce, apples, and soup.



Veterans Memorial Hall Challenge Matched

Thanks to a tremendous outpouring of community support, it took just six months to reach the \$100,000 goal to fund Essex Veterans Memorial Hall's expansion and renovation project. Donations from the community hit the \$50,000 mark in March, triggering the Foundation's \$50,000 match and a celebratory presentation at the Centerbrook site.

Equipping Sensory Gym for Children with Developmental Challenges

The Foundation answered a call for support from Middlesex Health's The Mayer Center, a comprehensive service provider for children and adolescents with autism, sensory processing disorder, speech disorders, cerebral palsy and other developmental challenges. A \$10,000 grant helped equip the sensory gym at the new state-of-the-art facility in Essex.



Barnes Callender Annual Scholarship Award

Tabitha Hardgrove was awarded a \$3000 scholarship to support her environmental studies at Rochester Institute of Technology. The award is given each year to honor the bequest and



memory of the late Elizabeth "Diz" Callender and her sister Mary Frances Barnes to a Valley Regional High School graduating senior or an Essex resident pursuing studies related to land conservation and preservation, including the fields of agronomy, biology, botany, ecology, horticulture, floriculture, forestry, landscape design, and environmental science.

First Congregational Church Meal Outreach Program

A \$1000 grant was awarded to the FCC Essex Outreach and Justice Committee to support the group's community mission project that supplies special meals to local area residents who struggle to feed themselves. The project, which is dependent on donations from congregants and the greater community, provides Thanksgiving and mid-winter meals to families identified by the Tri-Town schools, as well as to Essex Court and Essex Place residents.
